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# Stained Glass Window Symbols and Explanations

With the crucifix at the front, beginn the sanctuary, facing the right sidenoving left to right:

#### Window #1

- x Rex Gloria King of Glory
- x Latin Cross Inside an Ovachway
  The oval shaped archway, or vesica, represents Mary's womb, from which Christ came, the cross signifies Christ. Together they represent the birth of Christ.

#### Window #2

x Gladiolus

This flower represents the incarnation, the word made flesh. The green legared survival and renewal; they are emblematic of the Savior.

x Anchor Cross

This symbol was carried over from the days of persecution, before Constantine. Early Christians had to conceal their religious practices; the anchor was their disguised sign of the cross. It was symbolic of Hope in Jesus Christ, "this hope we have, as a sure and firm anchor of the soul ... " (Hebrews 6:19)

#### Window #3

x Circle

The circle is eternal without ending; this is symbolic of eternal existence.

- x Agnus Dei Lamb of God
- x Lamb

This is the symbol of Jesus, taken from the gospel passage that proclaims Jesus as the Lamb of God.

#### Window #4

#### x Circled dined to the Ltin Cross

The latin cross has a longer upright than a crossbar; it resembles a person with arms outstretched. It was chosen because it represented memory in Jesusife and his resurrection. Joined with the circle, this symbolizes sus'eternal existence.

#### Window #5

# x Lux Mundi Light of the World

#### x Crown of Thorns

This is known as the mocking crown, symbolic of humiliation and defeat which ultimately gave way to Christ's glory in his resurrection.

Facing the left side of the sanctuary moving left to right:

#### Window #6

#### x Chalice and Host

Thehost is a flat round piece of unleavened bread which is symbolic of the manna githren to Jews in the desert. Its name comes from the Latin word "hostia" meaning victim. The chalice is the cup of salvation, the source of never ending sustenance. Whehoustias shown above the chalice, it symbolizes the sacrifice of Christ upon the cross.

# x Grapes

This fruit is used to make the Eucharistic wine and is symbolic of the blood of Christ and his sacrifice; Christ called himself the "true wine" (John 45):1

#### x Wheat

This symbolizes bread, the staff of life from which abundant blessings flow.

#### Window #7

#### x IC XC

These are the first and last letters of the Greek word for Jesus.

#### NI KA

This is the Greek word for conquers. Together the above means Jesus Christr&onque

#### x Staff and Serpent

The brazen serpent collided around the cross refers to John 3:14, "As Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of man be lifted up."

#### Window #8

# x Triangle

This is the most popular symbol of the Holy **Try**n it is usually an equilateral triangle. It represents the three equal parts of the Holy Trinity.

#### x Basket and Bread

The number three denotes the Holy Trinity. The bread, which contains on arks, symbolizes Christ's sacrifice.

#### x Fish

Fish were used as a symbol of Christianity as a time when Christians were persecuted for their beliefs. Since **fising** was a way of life, the fishas a common sight. Christians could identify each other by drawing a fish in the sand; fish were also used to point the way to Christian services in the catacombs. A single fish represents Christ, several fish represent faithful Christians.

#### Window #9

#### x Chi Rho Cross

This is the monogram of the first two letters to Greek word for Christ: CHI (X) and RHO (P). The letters are the abbreviation for the name of Christ.

#### x IXOYC

This is the Greek word for "fish;" the fish was used to point the way to underground worship services at a time in history when the Christianese persecuted for their religious beliefs. The letters stand for "Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior."

# Window #10

#### x Water

This is a symbol of the sacrament of Baptism which was instituted by Christ. The old life is washed away and new life is sanctified in the sacrament of Baptism.

#### x Pebbles

Early Christians and mkm would gather up pebbles in the desert to use as a rosary. There are seven of these pebbles; seven is a significant number tribes, seven loaves and fish, etc.

With the crucifix at the front, begin by facing the right side of the Chapel, moving left to right.

#### Window #11

x Carpenter's Angle and arthmer Thisis to symbolize St. Joseph, the carpenter.

x Chi Rho Cross with thetter "M" Symbolizes that Mary is the "Mother of Christ"

#### x Scales of Justice

Mary was called the "Mirror of Justice and Joseph was referred to as a "just" man. Scales are an emblem of the archangel Michael, regarded as guardian of the church and its members. He weighs the souls of men and women on the Last Day.

#### x Lilies

These flowers denote the "Mother Most Pure;" shownes from the Litany. The white, three petaled lilies symbolize purity and innocence; they are a symbol of Mary's virginity and innocence.

#### Window #12

# x Three Intertwined Circles

Circles have no apparent beginning or end. The three circles symbolize the Holy Trinity, the eternal nature of each erson in the Godhead. They are intertwined to show unity between the three Godheads.

#### x Three Candles

They represent Jesus, the light of the world. Three candles refer to the Holy Trinity.

#### Window #13

#### x Sunflower

This flower denotes the soul turning to Christ, just as a sunflower turns toward the sun.

#### Window #14

x Some symbols are used several times; this window repeats the use of the Chi Rho cross and the equilateral triangle.

#### Window #25

## x Descending Bird

Symbolizes the Holly Spirit descending upon God's people.

## x Ark of the Covenant

Thisis taken from the Litany to Mary; she was referred to as the "Ark of the Covenant" because she was the vessel which carried Jesus forth into this world for all to behold. The color purple used on the Ark signifies mourning, penitence, humility, suffering pathy, and fasting.

#### Window #26

#### x Chalice with Host

These two objects symbolize the body and dod of Christ, his sacrifice for us. The bread meets our physical needs and the Holy Eucharist meets our spiritual needs.

#### x Candles

The candles refer to theight of the Word, Jesus and his faithful followers.

#### Window #27

# x Equilateral Triangle within a Circle

The circle has no beginning or end; it stands for eternity and signifies eternal existence. The circle surrounds the trianglewhich symbolizes the Holyillity, the three equal parts joined as one.

#### Window #28

#### x Volumes of ClosedoBoks

These books were possibly used to symbolize Elizabeth Seton who founded the first native American religious community for women, the Sisters of Charity. She also opened the first American parish school, and established the first American catholic orphanage.

#### x Sun

This is a symbol of Jesus Christun of righteousnesshall "rise with healing instwings." Both the Son and the Sun bring light and life to the world. There is a triangle attached to one of the sun's ray representing the Holy Trinity. Through the Holy Trinity, you will find the light.
